AS GLOBAL stock markets plunge and people across the world fear for their health amid the COVID-19 outbreak, a Narrandera pharmacist has called for residents to be prepared rather than panicky.

Supermarket shelves in the region were swept bare of toilet paper and hand sanitiser in a stockpiling frenzy, leaving many customers empty-handed in Narrandera, Leeton, Griffith, Wagga Wagga and Albury-Wodonga.

On Monday, Coles Narrandera's shelves were devoid of toilet paper but were restocked overnight.

In a statement, Coles announced a temporary nation-wide limit of one pack per customer while Woolworths limited customers to a two-pack transaction as their suppliers bolstered production to cope.

Australians are being urged by pharmacists to make flu vaccinations a priority in the light of the COVID-19 outbreak.

Although the vaccine is not effective to prevent COVID-19, Australians could help reduce the number of influenza cases to lessen the burden on the public health system when COVID-19 cases are expected to rise.

Last year's record breaking flu season claimed 902 lives and infected more than 313,000 people nationally.

With more than 80 coronavirus cases and three deaths already in Australia and more expected, this winter is anticipated to be a and we can deliver.

Narrandera pharmacist Melissa Close said if people were symptomatic (fever, cough, sore throat or shortness of breath) they should not attend pharmacies, medical centres or hospitals.

Mrs Close said they should self-quarantine at home and phone the Health Direct Line 1800 022 222

"They will be triaged by a nurse, and then advised about what to do next. If they require testing, this will be organised before they go to the hospital," she said.

"If people are unwell or asked to stay at home, they can place orders from the pharmacy over the phone

Close Pharmacy has experienced a run on hand sanitiser but reserves face masks for those displaying symptoms of the virus.

"As the news of the outbreak started to develop, we have had people coming in looking for face masks and hand sanitiser - people are taking it seriously and are trying to be prepared as possible," Mrs Close said.

"Everyone is concerned and that is quite appropriate as we are a town with a high older population so we have to do whatever we can to protect our older community."

As front line service providers, pharmacy staff have followed advice from the Pharmacy Guild of Australia and NSW Health.

"We have cleared off all our benches and are following cleaning procedures at least every few hours, and staff are using hand sanitiser constantly to minimise their and the community's exposure," Mrs Close said.

"We are trying to be as proactive as possible."

Mrs Close said the pharmacy was unable to source face masks for retail sale but had masks for symptomatic customers only.

"If people seek our advice as they are unwell, our protocol is to give them a face mask, send them home and ask them to contact the Health Direct Line.'

The Narrandera Medical Centre requires patients exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms to phone staff in advance

for advice.

According to the Murrumbidgee Primary Health Network, masks have been distributed across the region to general practice and pharmacies.

The Australian Government has secured additional surgical, P2 and N95 masks for medical and aged care professionals to care for patients with suspected or confirmed cases of COVID-

COVID-19 is a new strain of coronavirus not previously identified in humans and is most likely spread through close contact with an infectious person.

Mrs Close said diarrhoea was not a symptom of the virus and the toilet paper continued page 2

Creek robbed of voice

A BOTTOM-UP approach is needed to give the Yanco Creek system a voice in the proposed Murrumbidgee valley water saving supply measure projects.

A report released by the Australian Institute has warned the proposed water projects in the Yanco Creek system will destroy its integrity.

Independent advisors Maryanne Slattery and Bill Johnson in their report "Up Effluent Creek – Supply measures in the Yanco Creek system", point to water savings achieved by reducing operational surplus and transmission losses as robbing the Yanco Creek System environment, most likely for irrigation in the Murrumbidgee.

The \$84 million project proposes to install a new regulator where the Yanco Creek leaves the Murrumbidgee, and increase the weir pool level at Yanco weir so environmental flows can be provided to Yanco Creek.

The project also involves updates to infrastructure, improved monitoring and changes to river operation rules to allow more flexibility and control in when water is delivered to the Yanco, Colombo and Billabong creeks.

They are among 36 NSW supply measure projects aimed to reduce operational surplus and transmission losses by 605 gigalitres for diversion to targeted environmental watering.

The Australian Institute report was critical of the lack of hydrological indicator sites in the system used in the Basin Plan modelling, leaving it open to a legal challenge.

"If this project goes ahead, the diverted water from the Yanco Creek System is likely to increase supplementary flows in the Murrumbidgee and be legally extracted and stored in the new large on-farm storages in the Murrumbidgee, built specifically to capture supplementary flows," the report stated.

"It will damage the Yanco Creek System, leaving local people and the environment proverbially up effluent

The 800km long system supplies water to the townships of Morundah, Urana, Oaklands, Jerilderie, Conargo, Wanganella and Moulamen, as well as 250 licenced water users.

But a lack of consultation with those users had led to significant community concern about what the projects mean for the creek system. water users and the community.

Yanco Creek and Tributaries Advisory Council (YACTAC) is calling for minimum daily flow limits in the Murrumbidgee Water Resource Plan at the Yanco Creek off take to ensure the upper section is not left stranded.

YACTAC president Bob Crawford said efficiencies should not be gained by degrading one ecosystem for

Mr Crawford said the Yanco regulator Sustainable Diversion Limit Adjustment Mechanism (SDLAM) project, which is based on the WaterNSW 2015 business case, does not pass the "pub test" cost benefit analysis with usage limited to two to three days, once every three to

"There are other ways of gaining savings or being smarter with the way water is moved around the system -5GL in the Yanco delivers many more benefits than 5GL in the Murrumbidgee," he said.

"It is about economies of scale a small volume of water in a small system equals big benefits versus a small volume of water in a large system equals little difference.

"It is disappointing to see the irrigation corporations so noisy and brazen in this argument.

"After all, Australians are trying to accommodate the new dictates of the Murray Darling Basin Plan."

Mr Crawford said YACTAC stood by many of the statements made by the Australian Institute report.

A survey by YACTAC of more than 300 local people showed:

- 85 per cent or respondents have poor understanding of the projects
- 90 per cent of respondents consider consultation to be appalling
- 86 per cent have no confidence in the department responsible for the
- 88 per cent have moderate or high concern about the projects

Research scientist and YACTAC advisor Dr Dale McNeil said the SDLAM projects did not consider the natural environment of the Yanco Creek.

"The models developed by the MBDA used indicator points on the Lower Murrumbidgee for the environmental requirements but none were in the Yanco Creek," Dr McNeil said.

"If we ask the question will this water do more good if we build the weir and send it down the Murrumbidgee, the answer is always yes but there is no accounting for the damage that does to the environment of the Yanco Creek.

"We need a whole new process for the ecological aspect and the environment of the Yanco Creek to have an equal voice.'

Dr McNeil said the Yanco was home to threatened species including the Southern Bell Frog, trout cod. Murray catfish and platypus.

"The whole of the Yanco Creek doesn't rate a mention in the Basin

"We need a bottom-up approach and start with a detailed knowledge and comprehensive data at a local scale rather than the top down

Dr McNeil advocates for a financial injection into independent environmental and agricultural research owned and trusted by the irrigation community.

The next SDLAM stakeholder meeting will be held on March 25 at Jerilderie.

The Argus has sought comment from the NSW Department of Planning, Industry and Environment.



Buoyant autumn outlook

starts to autumn in years with falls of 50-100mm throughout the district last week, buoying hopes for a good winter cropping season.

According to the Bureau of Meteorology, Narrandera airport received 92mm over March 4-6, with the 71mm falling on Thursday.

This puts the shire well ahead of the average for March of 30.7mm while the wettest day on record was 155mm in 1989.

The total for the year so far is 187.2mm or 54 per cent up on the average.

At other centres, 94.3mmmm fell at Yanco, 59.2mm at Temora, 78.2mm at Lockhart, 43.2mm at Griffith, 69.2mm at Wagga Wagga and 71mm at West Wyalong.

Nutrient Ag Solutions Narrandera agronomist Dave Sergeant described the rain as a fantastic top up to February's falls.

Mr Sergeant said the general soaking rain contributed to soil moisture after the summer storm run-off last month.

"Most people are happy with how much moisture it has put in the soil profile - lucerne has gone beserk and people will be able to get some real summer weeds including melons, burrs, heliotrope and catheads, along with winter weeds such capeweed, ryegrass, barley grass and Paterson's curse. 'In a week or 10 days, there will be a bit more

spraying going on," Mr Sergeant said. He said early oat crops had already been sown

around the district and within the next week winter grazing wheat crops would go in. This time last year we were looking at dust

with nothing on the horizon - this area is now looking as good as anywhere. "Pretty much 50-100mm was the range in the area I look after. The water situation has changed

dramatically in the last six weeks. Things are positive at the moment considering where we have been - with this subsoil moisture

we can go into the season with confidence. "If the season does peter out, we do have that stored subsoil moisture there to back up on."

Mr Sergeant said finding backload for fertiliser was difficult and there were supply issues with Glyphosate, Treflan and Boxer Gold due to the widespread rain and Covid-19 induced shipping

Proactive efforts on waste management

THE Narrandera Shire Council will support the Save Our Recycling campaign being co-ordinated by LGNSW.

Narrandera Mayor Cr Neville Kschenka said there was a growing imperative to manage waste and recycling within NSW and he called for urgent action from the State Government to help build a circular economy in NSW.

Initiatives and projects already under taken within the Narrandera Shire local government area to help achieve this goal include the installation of a Return and Earn Vending Machine at the waste depot and kerb-side comingled recycling.

Council is reviewing the feasibility of Food and Organics waste disposal.

The Council endorsed Local Government NSW's sector-wide Save our Recycling campaign and asked the State Government to reinvest the Waste Levy in the

sharing it with their own networks across the Narrandera local government area.

Cr Kschenka said the NSW Government collected revenue from a Waste Levy via licensed waste facilities in NSW to discourage the amount of waste being landfilled and to promote recycling and resource recovery.

According to the latest NSW Budget papers, this totalled \$772 million in 2018/19.

Revenue from the Waste Levy is expected to increase by about 70 percent from 2012/13 to 2022/23. By the end of this period the Waste Levy revenue is forecast to have increased to more than \$800 million a year.

Complaint against MP dismissed

AN ANONYMOUS National Party MP's complaint about Member for Murray Helen Dalton has been dismissed by the NSW Speaker, saying it was now time for every MP and political donor to come clean on their water interests.

"That unnamed MP then reported me to The Speaker, requesting that I be investigated by the ethics committee."

NSW Parliament Speaker and Liberal Party MP Jonathan O'Dea informed the House he found no precedence to uphold the complaint. He will not refer the matter to the ethics committee.

Time to mulch

time of maintenance, even survival in the garden. I just went for a walk around my garden and found my naked lady

MID to late summer is a

around my garden and found my naked lady lily was flowering. They need to be out in the open, and bloom spectacularly at the local cemetery where they are undisturbed.

While I was outside I wanted to see how much good that lovely drop of rain had done and found another tree had not survived – a Hakea bucculenta, about four metres tall with occasional flowers like flaming torches.

You would not pick it as a hakea except for its 'bird's head' seeds and I will gather a handful to start a replacement. Apparently its roots were weak from the drought and it just fell across the car track when its soil became wet and soft

TOMATOES:
Probably the most popular home grown fruit/veg but not the easiest. Plant into new ground each year and water evenly and consistently to avoid 'Blossom End Rot'. Cherry tomatoes are the easiest. I'm not a successful tomato grower and usually find they are cheap when mine are

ready, so I buy them.

ROSES need a light summer prune and feed to produce that great autumn flush in 50 days. I'm not a rose grower but have a few bushes

and have had at least one rose in a vase, sometimes a bunch, all summer. They certainly are worth growing, but need lots of feeding.

LEMONS: "What's wrong with my lemon tree?" This is the commonest question on talkback garden radio and the answer is usually "it's starving". Like roses and passionfruit, lemons are gross feeders. Buy a bag of citrus food, read the directions and use it on all three.

Collar rot is another fairly common problem of citrus, avoided by keeping its mulch a couple of inches away from the trunk. Collar rot is treated by scraping off any signs of rot and painting with a paste of 'Bordeau" or similar – it works if caught early.

C L I M A T E CHANGE: I think everyone accepts our future is going to be hotter, drier and wilder than we are accustomed to and so we need to adjust our gardens accordingly. Here are a few suggestions:

- Do not replace a thing that died with another the same;
- choose plants that are thriving locally OR things that thrive around Hay or Broken Hill;
- Avoid plants that need a lot of water.

Summer annuals are the worst offenders and my beloved ferns will not be replaced as they die;

• Don't ever choose plants because they look

year because I can't resist a pot of each – so much for sensible climate change gardening.

RANUNCULI:
I always start my ranunculi in trays: 4 sheets newspaper, 2cm mix (cheapest potting mix, plus sand, plus good soil), press in the claws, just cover with more mix. Water and keep damp and in shade till leaves appear.

Move into light sunshine and when big enough to handle plant into good soil: make a trowel sized hole, add a good pinch of fertiliser, fill with water and put in your well rooted ranunculi – never fails. Extra hints: when lifting ranunculi claws, cut off the dry foliage leaving an inch of stems to use to


handle the claws – soaking for half an hour before planting, to press into mix and especially when lifting out at transplanting time and a useful marker when awaiting the first leaves. Last year's claws may be separated into several at soaking time or planted as large clumps.

In 2019 there were 352 people who lost their lives on NSW roads, with two thirds of the fatalities occurring on country roads.

"Any death on the roads is one death too many

however we have seen significant reductions in a number of areas in 2019," said Bernard Carlon, Executive Director of the NSW Centre for Road Safety.

"However 2019's road toll has seen an emerging

trend amongst a different group of road users – men aged 30 to 59 – with 115 dying on NSW roads, up by 13 on the previous year."

These deaths represent families losing their

father, uncle or brother. Communities losing their friend, colleague, team mate or club member. Local statistics support this trend with 30 per cent

of drivers in fatal and injury crashes in Narrandera Shire for the period 2014-2018 aged 30 to 59.

Men in this age group account for the majority of road fatalities in NSW country areas. Despite this fact, this group of drivers are still likely to justify risky decisions when they get in the car.

"Our research tells us that men admit to taking more risks when they drive alone – especially speeding. In 2019 84 people died in speed related crashes where a man was driving alone," continued Mr Carlon.

Despite the fact that the majority of fatalities on country roads are local residents, Transport for NSW research found country drivers often resist the notion that the way they drive puts themselves or others at risk. There is also a tendency for complacency, over confidence and lower perception of risk when driving on familiar roads.

While there are a number of unique factors contributing to higher risk on country roads – higher speeds, roadside hazards such as trees and embankments, longer travel distances and older vehicles – research shows that driver behaviour is still the most significant factor in crashes.

Speeding, driver fatigue, drink driving and not wearing a seatbelt are more likely to contribute to country fatalities and serious injuries.

Everyone has a role to play in keeping our community, especially middle aged men, safe on the road. We need to challenge the perceptions and encourage safer driving behaviour.

We need to stop taking risks and stop accepting excuses to justify risky behaviours. We need to discourage drivers from driving a bit above the speed limit, driving tired, driving after drinking, driving when affected by drugs or not wearing a seatbelt.

If you live in the country, you are around four times more likely to die in a road crash than if you live in a metropolitan area. This is unacceptable. We need to make a change.





Dual scholarship winners

Such was the calibre of the finalists in the prestigious sheep and wool industry's Peter Westblade scholarship that joint winners have been announced.

Be aware of spray

Stop Off-target Spraying Riverina Valleys Chairman Kevin Sternberg has reminded spray operators that extreme care must be taken when spraying weeds.

"I know people are keen to get weeds under control, but we all have to be careful to prevent spray drift," Mr Sternberg said.

"By working together to mitigate off-target spray drift, we can ensure our region's farmers don't lose crops and suffer further stress after what's been a challenging time with the drought."

By following the

ments' of spray drift prevention, the risk of drift can be mitigated.

The five commandments are:

- 1. Don't spray during inversionsurface conditions;
- 2. Use the largest spray quality possible while maintaining efficacy;
- 3. Keep boom height as low as possible (less than 50cm above spray target);
- 4. Avoid travelling at high speeds (less than 22km/h);
- 5. Avoid using adjuvants that decrease droplet side.

Mr Sternberg said keeping chemical on a landholder's property was their responsibility.

"Let's be mindful about where and what

drift this autumn sure your spray stays

on your farm," he said. SOS Riverina Valleys was formed in early 2019 with representation from all farming industries (including cotton, dryland cropping and grazing, rice, grains, apiarists and hortiproduction cultural advisors, suppliers/ chemical resellers, spray applicators, councils, government departments and water supply organisations across the Riverina region. 
